READING, DYSLEXIA, AND SUPPORTING STUDENTS WHO ARE STRUGGLING

Literacy is essential for students to flourish at school, and to decode the world of books, websites, menus, manuals, and messages that awaits them. But for some children, learning to read can be a complex challenge.

Dr David Armstrong, an expert in education psychology and inclusive education at Flinders University, is the lead author of *Key Perspectives on Dyslexia*. Here, he draws on his research and more than a decade's experience as a specialist teacher to offer insights on teaching reading and helping students with dyslexia overcome obstacles to learning.

For most children reading is smoothly learned and quickly becomes automatic. However, Dr Armstrong says a complex set of skills are in operation when we read, and different parts of the brain are used to complete what seems like a simple task.

With complexity, comes the risk that some part of the system or process will go wrong in learning to read. Teachers, parents or psychologists label children facing these issues as having 'learning difficulty', reading disability or dyslexia.

Understanding more about how most children successfully learn to read can help teachers understand what to do for children facing difficulties. *Key Perspectives on Dyslexia* describes the Pre-reading, Early-reading and Consolidation reading stages, and what a teacher might see in each stage.

In the pre-reading phase (around 3 – 5 years old), it is common to teach children an awareness of phonemes; these are the 44 individual sounds used in spoken English, such as 'th', 'a' and 't' in 'that'. Research into reading has suggested that this awareness of phonemes and of how to isolate and manipulate them is a vital ingredient for learning to read.

Dr Armstrong and his co-author Dr Garry Squires say that learning about sounds should be fun and play-based: "Letters can, for example, be modelled in clay and painted on paper using different colours as part of artwork."

Such activities lay foundations for later learning. "Parents and caregivers can support this process by regularly reading age-appropriate stories to children. These might be chosen by children themselves with parental guidance and become part of a 'bedtime' ritual."

- No make-up, including nail polish

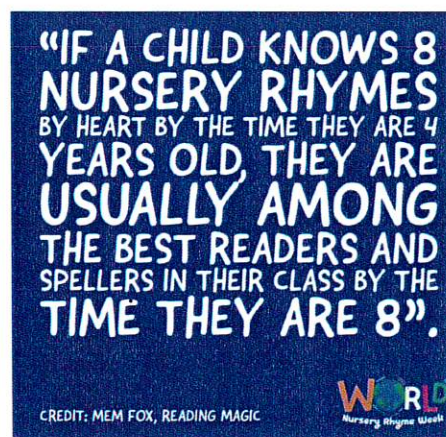

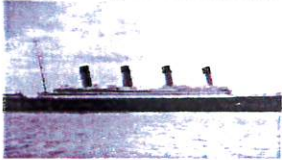

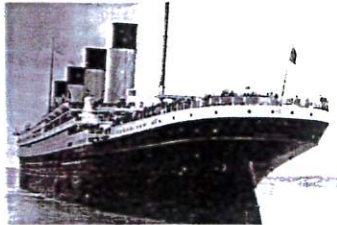

Happily cruising, thousands of people dead, Titanic terribly sinks. 1,490 people have died and only 711 survivors. It started to sink at 11.40pm 14th and finished 2.20am 15th. The biggest cruise liner fell to Titanic

WHAT HAPPENED?

Cruising peacefully across the calm ocean the Titanic hits an ice berg opening, more than 6 bulkheads. The big ship sunk to the bottom of the Atlantic Ocean. Many people went down with the ship and died as a result of the one degree above freezing water. Most of the women survived and most of the men died terribly. The Titanic took about 4 hours to sink and people did make it to shore sad, weak, shocked and full of terrible feelings inside.

Titanic launch!

The launching of the Titanic was a big event and the voyage soon ended. The large ship sank in the north Atlantic Ocean. The Titanic took two years and two months to build and it sunk in four days. What a pity. The Titanic was the largest ship in the world and it is a shame that it sunk so soon.

- The binoculars for the lookout were left behind when the ship set sail from Belfast
- Third class had only two bath-tubs for over 700 people

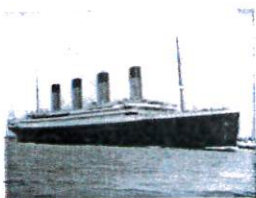

1,517 people die in the sinking of the Titanic!

Titanic facts

1,517 people lost their lives when the "unsinkable" sunk. The HMS Titanic went under at 2:20 am yesterday morning. It struck the iceberg at 11 40 pm 14th April.

On the ship there were 16 life boats and 4 collapsible life boats which is enough to save half the people on board. It cost \$7.5 million dollars to build and was worth \$400 million in 2012. Out of all the people who died only 306 bodies were found. When the passengers boarded the ship it was so brand new that the paint was still wet.



Edward John Smith
The captain of the Titanic was Edward John Smith. He was a very experienced sailor and had been in the Royal Navy for many years. He was also a member of the Admiralty and had been in charge of the ship for many years. He was a very good man and he was very brave. He was the captain of the Titanic when it sank and he was the last man to see the ship go down.



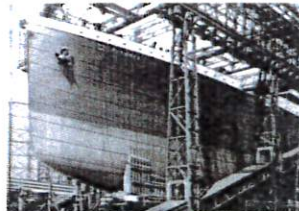
Unsinkable: Sunk

The supposedly 'unsinkable' RMS Titanic has sunk at 2:20am on April 15th, killing over 1500 people. It struck ice off the coast of New Foundland in the North Atlantic, before sinking to the bottom of the ocean. Most people who entered the slightly above freezing water didn't survive more than a few minutes due to hypothermia.

The RMS Titanic sunk when it hit an unseen iceberg. Initial reports indicate that the crew were unable to see and avoid the iceberg because the subscribed binoculars had been left at dock. It has also been reported that a life boat drill was cancelled the day of the sinking.

Carpathia was the first on the scene of this horrific sinking. It is said that many other ships were in the area but Carpathia was the first to respond. The SS California was the closest ship but did not respond to any distress calls. When questioned about this the captain of the Carpathia stated that he believed the flares were a form of fireworks and that the ships passengers were having a party.

One survivor who is being majorly criticized is Bruce Ismay, owner of the White Star Line. It is said that there were still large numbers of women and children on the ship when he boarded one of the life boats. He is being majorly criticized for leaving those women and children to die in the frigid water.



The RMS Titanic is believed to have been the world's largest man-made moving object to date, measuring at a size of 882 feet and 9 inches. It had a top speed of 26 miles per hour.

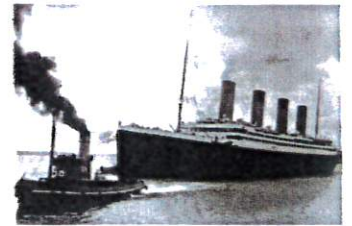

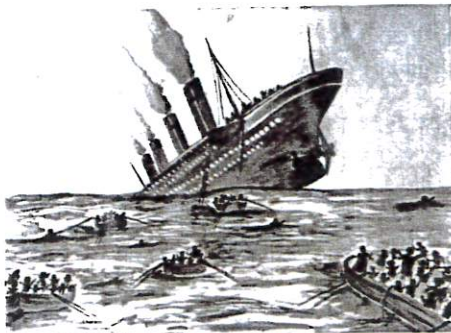

On the 15th of April 1912 the famous Titanic was calving the lives of 1,517 passengers crew members on board. The day before (14th of April) the Titanic hit the iceberg. The ice-berg punctured holes in 6 of the decks causing the ship to sink. First the stern of the ship (bow) started to go down, then the ship started to tilt to one side before snapping in two pieces. The ship was designed to stay afloat at if two bulkheads on either side were filled with water.

There were 20 life boats, each could hold 50 people. In total the boats could hold 1000 people but the crew didn't fill any to full capacity. They only saved 711 people out of 2201 people on the Titanic and they pulled out 7 people out of the water.

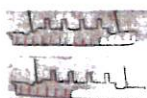

Little is known about Captain Edward John Smith. He was 62 years of age when the tragedy of the Titanic happened. He was last seen on the bridge, where he made order to abandon ship. Reports say that he gave no effort to help himself and he waited for his death in the wheelhouse.

The Titanic, the 'Unsinkable Ship' has sunk claiming 1517 people's lives on the 15th of April, 1912. Titanic struck an iceberg at 11:40 pm and sunk at 2:20 am, off the coast of Newfoundland in the Atlantic Ocean. Out of the 2240 passengers on the great ship, 711 survived.

The Titanic hit the iceberg at 11:40pm on the port side. It collided against the iceberg opening four of the sixteen bulkheads. It soon poured into two more. The Captain of the ship, Captain Smith, called the all clear and continued but that just made it worse. The Titanic took 160 minutes to sink (1 hour and 40 minutes). The Titanic sunk at 2:20 am. Reports suggest the Titanic split in half before it sank into the depths of the Atlantic Ocean. The Titanic struck ice on the 14th of April but it actually sunk on the 15th of April at 2:20am.

499 of the 1316 passengers on the Titanic survived leaving 817 people to perish. Out of the Crew members 212 people survived and 671 died. Bruce Ismay, the owner of the Titanic survived, leaving women and children to perish. Witnesses say he got onto the last life boat.

The Titanic was a very expensive ship costing 7.5 million dollars to build. It was the most luxurious ship ever made. In first class, they had 125 people, and 121 of those people died. In second class, they had 285, and 169 of those people died. Out of the third class passengers, 518 out of the 706 people died.

The Titanic was built between 1909 and 1911. It was built by White Star Line. It was designed with 16 water tight bulkheads which gave it its name 'unsinkable' because if only 4 of the bulkheads were compromised it would have survived, because the water-tight doors would automatically drop and seal. The Titanic was 882 feet in length (269m) and 175 feet in height (53 m).

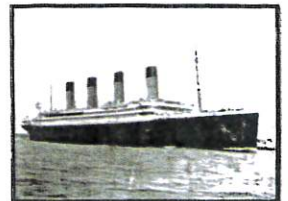

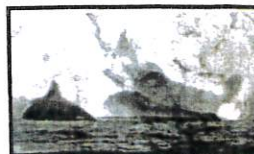
CARPATHIA RESCUES 711 PASSENGERS AND CREW

On the night of April 15, the largest ocean liner in the world owned by White Star Line and claimed unsinkable, plunges to the bottom of the Atlantic Ocean, claiming the lives of 1496 People. Surviving crew and passengers claim that the mighty vessel hit an iceberg at 11:40 PM, April 14, and went down within two hours.

Titanic was travelling from Belfast to New York, carrying letters, passengers and supplies. Some Survivors say the ship rose 45 degrees out of the water, before losing power and breaking in two underneath the third smokestack, whereas others claim the ship didn't break and instead capsized.



1496 PEOPLE DEAD



Rescue ship the Carpathia came at approximately 4:00 AM, an hour and a half after the Titanic slipped beneath the waves. The Carpathia managed to get 20 lifeboats, and some people in the water. The rescuers said that there were thousands of bodies floating in the water, most dead. They came back later to see if there were any more survivors, but all the bodies had mysteriously vanished.

The RMS Titanic was travelling through the Atlantic Ocean where at night the water is below -2.2222 degrees Celsius. Most of the passengers and crew died due to hyperthermia or frostbite. Bodies were seen floating in the water, most of them dead. Carpathia crew say that some people were on doors or chairs, floating on the water.



An artist's impression of how the RMS Titanic sunk

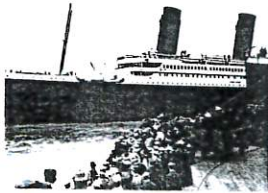
Biggest ship in the world sinks!

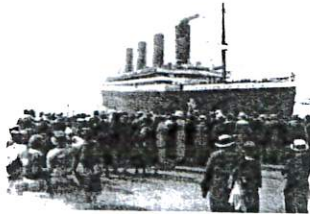

1,490 people are dead as the biggest ocean cruise liner in the world hits an iceberg! At 2:20am on the 15th of April 1912, the unsinkable Titanic sank to the bottom of the deepest ocean in the world. Only 711 people survived, mostly women and children. It was at 11:40pm when the ship began to sink. Within minutes, the water which was one degree above freezing, killed most of the people who fell in.

Would you set sail on a ship knowing that you're not guaranteed your life? Well that's exactly what these third class citizens did as they boarded the 'unsinkable' ship. Even though some first and second class passengers did not make it most of them did. The reason the third class passengers did not make it is because they were not guaranteed a life boat therefore 179 women died, 450 men died and 80 children died. With 709 people in third class, 284 people in second class and 324 people in first class dying.



The Titanic was launched from Belfast Lough on May 31, 1911. Ten months later, it struck an iceberg and sank on its maiden voyage to New York City. The 'unsinkable' British liner, 'Titanic' set sail out of Southampton, England, at the start of its doomed voyage in 1912.



The Titanic took 2 hours and 40 minutes to sink with the crew members doing what they could to get everybody (in particular the first and second class passengers and the women and children) off the ship and onto the lifeboats. Because (obviously) the people on the ship were reportedly panicking so a band played uplifting music to calm everybody down.

Lord Pirie made an inspection before giving the signal to launch, shortly after noon. In 62 seconds, Titanic was released down the greased slipway and into the water. Over the next 10 months she received her engines and fittings, transforming her into the ship that would depart Belfast on its maiden voyage.

THE UNSINKABLE HAS SUNK - APRIL 16 1912

At 2:15am on April 15th it is believed that luxury \$7.5M White Star Liner 'Titanic' sank to the bottom of the icy North Atlantic, taking with it an estimated 1,490 lives, and leaving 711 broken people, losing family members and belongings.

At 11:10pm on the 14th of April the Titanic reportedly struck an iceberg, which tore through the side of the ship, giving water access to enter six of the bulkheads. The ship was only designed to withstand four bulkheads being flooded. It is said the crew forgot the binoculars, so by the time they saw the iceberg it was already very close, meaning that the crew only had 30 seconds to steer away from the iceberg.



There was not much heard of the captain after he told everyone to evacuate, other than that he sacrificed his life. Though that was not the case for White Star Line's chairman, Joseph Bruce Ismay, who saved himself and is now taking on some severe criticism, being questioned by the media, who are all asking one question: why did you save yourself when the captain didn't? Sadly, we cannot answer this for you as he is refusing to respond to the press.

Onboard there was only enough lifeboats to hold half of the people onboard Titanic, but with the lifeboats only being filled to half capacity, only one third (roughly) of the people survived. It is extremely sad, lives needlessly being lost. Part of the reason that the lifeboats were not all filled is that another ship, Carpathia, should have arrived on time to save everyone, but the Titanic was extremely damaged, making it sink faster than expected, so Carpathia couldn't save everyone.

We will remember everyone who has lost their lives and pay our respects to their family and friends.

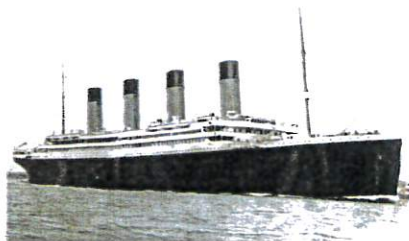

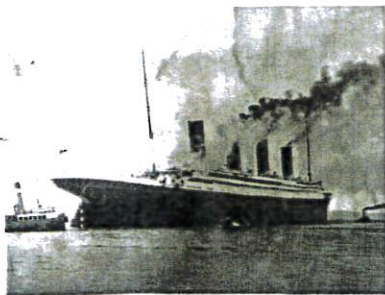

The Great 'Unsinkable' Ocean liner sunk!!!!

White Star Line Ocean Liner, RMS Titanic, sank after striking an Iceberg in the Atlantic Ocean on the 15th of April, at 2:20am. There were 3,300 people on board at the time.

705 individuals were rescued by RMS Carpathia but unfortunately, 1,500 people died because only 20 life boats were available and the Titanic would have been too cluttered with only 48 life boats.

There were 12 dogs on board the Titanic and only three of them survived. There were also 6,000 rats on board but we don't know how many survived.

There was 11,000 pounds of fresh fish, 40 tons of potatoes and 40,000 fresh eggs on board the Titanic. There were also 1,000 bottles of wine on board.

There were 325 people in first class, 284 in second class and 709 in the third class and there were 109 children on board and only 55 children survived.

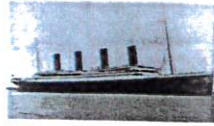

Charles Joughan, baker on board Titanic, was arguably the last man on Titanic alive and survived because he said "he did not want to go down sober" so he skulled an entire bottle of brandy. Brandy warms your body up and alcohol speeds your heart up so that is how he survived. He then dove into the degree above freezing water and still does not know why he is not dead. He said that he swam to a life boat, managing to hold on to his friend until morning.

The unsinkable Titanic has sunk at 2:19pm on the 15th of April 1912, killing 1500 people whilst 711 people survived. Initial reports suggest one of the problems was that the crew on lookout forgot the binoculars and they ended up seeing the iceberg too late to change course, meaning they tried to turn but scraped the iceberg causing the 6 of the water-tight bulkheads to become damaged. Therefore, it sunk because the ship was only designed to survive 4 bulkheads being compromised. There are many debates raging over the fact that the Titanic shouldn't have sunk so fast and killed so many people. One of the biggest criticisms is that if the bulkheads were built all the way to the top deck, it would have taken longer for the ship to sink. That means Carpathia would have reached the Titanic, meaning that less lives would have been lost. The other side of the debate is that the bulk heads would have been significantly bigger and made the ship look less grand.

Captain vanishes on board RMS Titanic
Captain Edward Smith is reported to have vanished after giving the call to evacuate. There are many theories surrounding where he went, one theory is that the man went down with the ship, hence the saying the captain always goes down with the ship. Another theory is that he got into a life boat and has been hiding. But this is an unlikely story.

At the time of the sinking there was a band on board playing uplifting music to the passengers as the ship went under the waves. Their names were Wallace Henry Hartley, Theodore Russell Brinkley, Roger Marnie Brown, John Wesley Woodward and Percy Cornelius Taylor. They played a string ensemble until they went down into the icy depths of the ocean. The men on board may have been a band on the ship, but they really did die as heroes.

There are rumours around whether the captain ordered the crew to shoot the third-class passengers or where the water was freezing. The third- and second-class survivors said that the doors were closed and everyone drowned horribly as a result because all the doors had been locked, leaving them no chance of escape. Some survivors have reported that this is untrue.

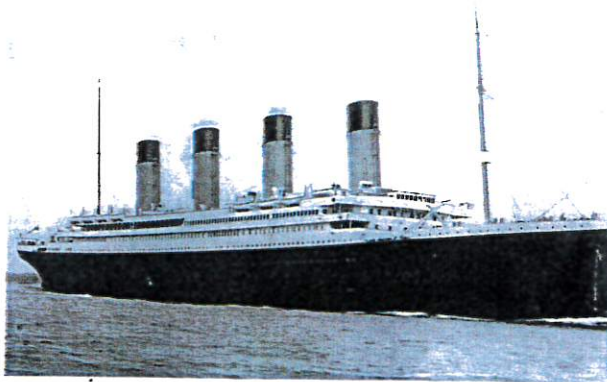

The 'Unsinkable' Titanic hit the iceberg 14th of April and sunk in the early morning of the 15th of April. Captain only saw the iceberg when it was a few meters in front of the ship, out of instinct, swerved, and created a 100m split in the side. First and Second Class evacuated first, women and children, then men! Most Third-Class citizens stayed on ship. Captain was last seen on ship, just before it went under. Reports blame the captain, some disagree and say he died with passion. Later, people blame the barrel men for not saying were the iceberg was.

Tons of luggage and letters lost with the ship. Families who won't return safely home. Owner of The White Starline, J.P. Morgan is says:

"It wasn't the White Star Line's fault; the captain is to blame" J.P. Morgan says when reporter June Lenard asks.

"The captain did not warn the rest of the ship, when the iceberg hit. He sat, and drank whisky. He did not try."

20 lifeboats were on the Titanic, all were filled up halfway, instead of complete. 16 of the lifeboats, 4 collapsible ones. People fell off into the sea, and the water was suddenly ruff. Passenger Sunny says:

"My mother got off the ship but fell into the water, I tried to save her but the life boat kept moving. Now I have to look after my 1 1/2 year old son without her." Sunny said, crying.

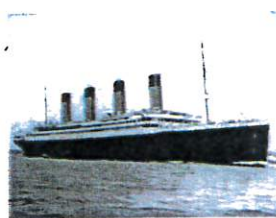

It might not have sunk if there were binoculars for the look-out crew so they could see the iceberg. Unfortunately, the binoculars were not on board the ship and so the lookout didn't see the iceberg until it was too late. The ship probably could have stayed afloat until Carpathia got there if the crew didn't turn and instead chose to just hit the iceberg with the front of the ship. Because the side was torn open, 5 water tight bulkheads were opened overwhelming the ship.

Captain Smith
Little is known about the last 2 hours of Captain Smith's life, he was 62 years old at the time the Titanic sunk. He was last seen on the bridge when he gave order to abandon ship. It is believed that he made no effort to save himself and that he waited for his death in the ship's wheelhouse.

Money
The first-class parlor suite tickets cost \$4,350 dollars. First class berth cost \$150 then second class was \$60 putting the price of third class tickets at between \$15-\$40.

The unsinkable ship sunk claiming 1,517 lives.
On April 14-1912 it struck an iceberg, they contacted all the ships in the area and only Carpathia responded. The iceberg hit the side of the ship and ruptured 6 bulkheads out of the 14 causing the water to roar over the bulkhead walls. This created too much water for the ship to hold so the bow snapped off and sunk to the bottom of the Atlantic Ocean. Later Carpathia arrived collecting all of the survivors in the life boats.
